Burnham Beeches Walks

Walks likely to be suitable for people with impaired mobility and users of wheelchairs, mobility scooters and pushchairs



Burnham Beeches is a large area of ancient woodland open to the public and has been designated as a National Nature Reserve. It has been owned and managed by the City of London since 1880. There are many miles of trails through the woodland and there is car parking, toilets and refreshments available.

i Path Information


There are many paths with hard surfaces, including roads now closed to traffic and an Easy Access Path. However Burnham Beeches is hilly and so there are some steep slopes in places. There are no stiles and the gates shown on the map are designed to allow wheelchairs and scooters. To help you decide which paths are suitable for you the map shows a selection of types of path marked with slopes, gates etc. For those wanting to explore there are also many natural challenging paths which are not shown on the map. - Public and disabled toilets.
- Opening times for the Beeches Café, public toilets and Information point are subject to seasonal variations but in general they are open between 10am and 5pm.






Path surfaces

- Tarmac road, can be used but beware of vehicles
- Hard smooth path (tarmac)
- Easy Access Path. Hard surface with occasional loose stones less than 10 mm. Seating at regular intervals.
- Wooden boardwalk. Hard & smooth.
- Sensory Trail follows part of the Easy Access Path and includes tactile sculptures, 5 accessible benches and an audio guide.

- Natural earth path. Firm but bumpy.
 Uneven with puddles/mud after rain.
 Some tree roots or loose stones up to 30 mm
